Every spring, a spectacle unfolds on the tiny island of Handa, nestled just off Scotland's far north-western coast. Nearly 100,000 seabirds – quillemots, great skuas, razor-bills, and puffins – descend upon this remote haven. While Handa is visible from various points along the mainland coastline, its proximity can be deceiving. Unless you're familiar with the landscape or have a map handy, you might miss the fact that it's actually an island. At its closest point, a mere 350 meters separates Handa from the mainland. On a sunny day, the swim might seem tempting, but the chilly water quickly dispels that notion. Reaching Handa requires a 10-minute ferry ride from the small pier at Tarbet, a hamlet 5.5 winding miles down the road from the larger village of Scourie. Approaching the island's eastern side, you'll be greeted by a surprisingly tranquil scene - a soft white-sand beach lapped by turquoise water. This calmness belies the island's true claim to fame: the steep cliffs teeming with seabirds. Day trips are the only way to experience Handa. The Handa Ferry operates from Tarbet pier between early April and early September, running Monday to Saturday. Outgoing journeys depart between 9:00 AM and 1:30 PM, with the last return ferry around 4:30 PM. Be sure to pack a picnic - the island has no food or drink facilities. Luckily, Scourie has a small grocery store for last-minute provisions. While a ranger and volunteers are available to answer questions about Handa, exploration is primarily self-guided along well-marked paths. The best time to witness the seabirds, especially the adorable puffins, is from mid-May to June. Life on Handa, despite its abundant natural beauty, comes with its challenges. "We rely heavily on the ferry service to get supplies from the mainland," shared one resident. "There was even a time when bad weather stranded us for eight days without any boats." However, he continued, "The peace and solitude of the island after the tourist season is unmatched. You adapt to island life surprisingly quickly."
